Year at a Glance: Programs and Impact

Community Outreach Activities

Across 12 months, Mehgawa Mahila Kalyan Samiti carried out over a dozen impactful programs in areas of health, skill-building, legal transparency, and community engagement. From camps and training to compliance and environmental initiatives, the Samiti has upheld its mission to uplift women and improve community well-being — with sincerity, structure, and social commitment.





April 2022 Initiatives

The new financial year began with a thorough review of past programs and performance. Internal meetings were held to evaluate ongoing needs and re-align goals. This month was primarily devoted to planning welfare activities, preparing documentation, and assessing potential collaborations for the year ahead.



May 2022

May was a month of groundwork. In a meaningful collaboration with Kadam Organisation, the Samiti launched the initiative “Aao Shehar Neem Se Dhak De”. Under this campaign, saplings—especially neem—were planted on the premises of Veterinary College, Jabalpur. This environmental initiative marked the beginning of a year rich with social impact and ecological responsibility.



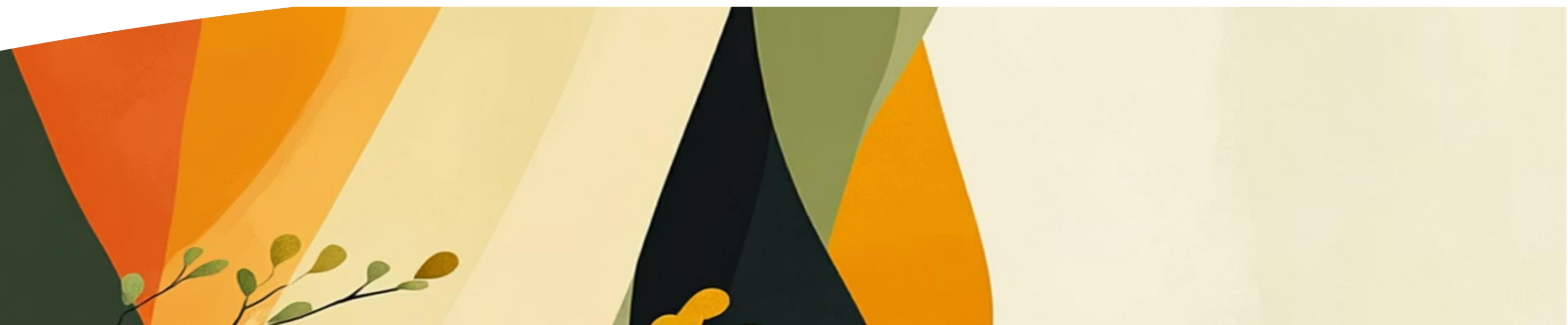
June 2022 Highlights

June marked the beginning of the Stitching Skill Development Program aimed at empowering women with livelihood-enhancing vocational skills. Training sessions were initiated with the support of experienced faculty, ensuring participants received both practical and theoretical knowledge. This initiative set the tone for the Samiti's commitment to skill-building.



July 2021 Outreach

A Self Help Group (SHG) was constituted by the Samiti in Gokalpur, aimed at empowering women through collective financial and skill-based development. The group focused on strengthening community participation and promoting micro-enterprise opportunities among local women.

August 2021 Programs

Independence Day was celebrated with the involvement of youth volunteers and local children through cultural events and patriotic activities. A women empowerment workshop focused on legal rights and domestic violence prevention, enhancing knowledge and support systems for women in the community.



On 12th August, the Samiti celebrated “Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav” to commemorate 75 years of India’s independence. A rally was organized under the “Har Ghar Tiranga” campaign, accompanied by a tree plantation drive.



As part of the Nasha Mukti Abhiyan, participants took an oath to abstain from substance abuse. The event was graced by Cantt MLA Shri Ashok Rohani and Ward Councillor Rajni Sahu as chief guests. On 14th August, the Samiti actively participated in the national initiative by hoisting the tricolor at homes across the city. Members also attended the grand cultural program at Bhawartal Cultural Street, further enhancing community spirit and patriotism.





October 2021 Campaigns



A powerful Nasha Mukti Awareness Program was organized to address substance abuse issues in the region. The event featured insights and guidance from esteemed guests including Shri Kamlesh Agrawal, TI Khamariya Nirupama Pandey, and Dr. Priya Mulchandani, who discussed the harmful effects of addiction and the importance of early intervention and community support.

November 2021

Highlights

Children's Day was celebrated with joy and warmth at a local Anganwadi center. The Samiti distributed pens, drawing kits, sweets, and organized games for the children, creating a joyful atmosphere that emphasized care, creativity, and community bonding.



January 2023 Programs

In a compassionate gesture, the Samiti distributed winter clothing to homeless residents living at Ren Basera shelters. During Makar Sankranti, rural girls were gifted sarees and food supplies, celebrating the festival with inclusiveness and joy. Additionally,



in collaboration with Deep Shrestha Foundation, an Eye Check-up Camp (Netra Shivir) was conducted, where 105 individuals received free eye tests and spectacles, bringing the gift of vision to many..



February 2023

Highlights

A Health Check-up Camp was organized, offering blood tests and full-body diagnostics. The initiative provided early detection and care support to economically challenged communities. In a truly heartwarming act, the Samiti facilitated the wedding of a financially underprivileged girl, ensuring her a dignified start and also providing essential gifts and support.





Financial Highlights

The financial year FY 2022-23 reflects sound fiscal management with transparency as a priority:

Total Income	Rs. 1,14,383
Total Expenditure	Rs. 98,781
Surplus	Rs. 15,602

In the financial year 2022–23, Mehgawa Mahila Kalyan Samiti received a total income of ₹1,14,383, sourced primarily from donations, member subscriptions, and interest earned. The total expenditure during the year stood at approximately ₹98,781, which was efficiently utilized for social welfare activities, community health programs, skill development training, legal compliance, and administrative overheads. The organization reported an annual surplus of ₹15,602, which was transferred to the balance sheet and will be used to fund future initiatives. The closing cash and bank balance as of March 31, 2023, amounted to ₹24,813. The accounts were audited by P.C. Madan & Co., Chartered Accountants, who confirmed that the financial records give a true and fair view of the organization's financial position. The audit report highlighted that proper accounting practices were followed, and all necessary documents were provided. Minor recommendations were made regarding the better maintenance of the cash book and the production of the minute book for future verification. Overall, the audit affirmed the Samiti's financial integrity, accountability, and readiness for sustained program delivery.

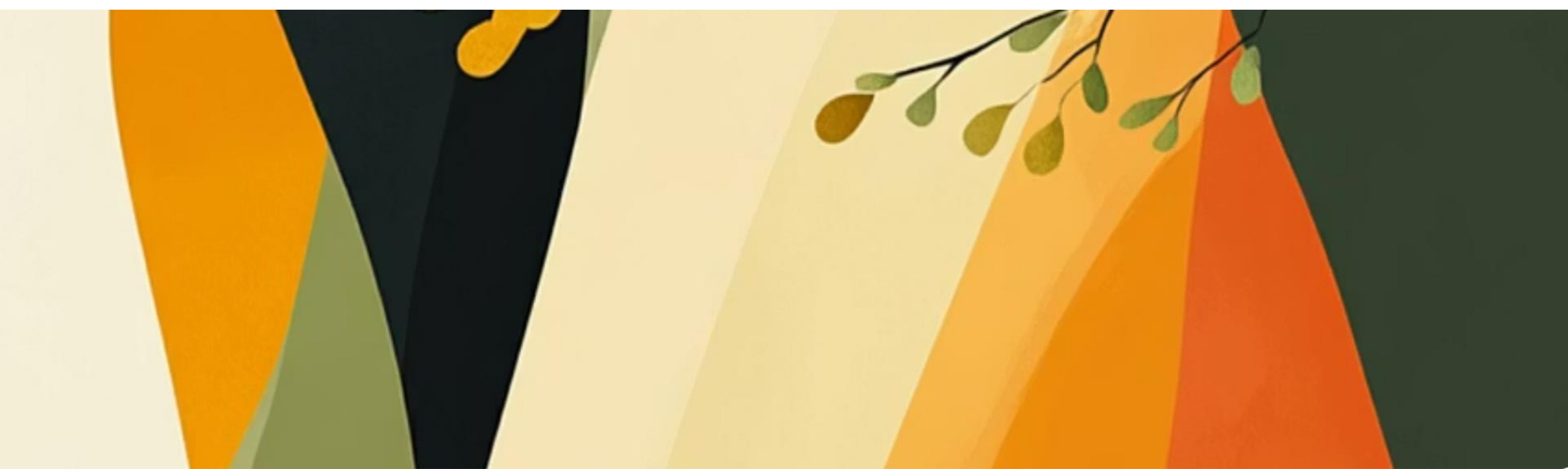
Our funding sources remain diverse, including donor contributions, government grants, and community fundraising efforts, ensuring financial stability and program continuity.
